

Bibliographic Citation:

MLA STYLE (7th EDITION)

- The works cited page should be arranged alphabetically by author's last name or by the title if there is no author.
- The entire list should be double-spaced, and the lines after the first line of each entry should be indented.
- The title, centered at the top of the page, should be Works Cited.
- Use the first city listed for the place of publication and the most recent copyright date for the date.
- Please consult the *MLA Handbook* for more information.

BOOKS

- One author** Author's last name, first name. *Title*. City of publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Medium of publication consulted (Print).
- Two or three authors** Author 1's last name, first name, Author 2's first name last name, and Author 3's first name last name. *Title*. City of Publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Medium of publication consulted (Print).
- More than 3 authors** Author 1's last name, first name, et al. *Title*. City of publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Medium of publication consulted (Print).
- Book in a series** Author's last name, first name. *Title*. Series title. City of publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Medium of publication consulted (Print).
- Anthology** Author of essay or piece's last name, first name. "Title of Essay or Piece." *Title of Book*, Editor, compiler, or translator. City of publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Page range for essay or piece. Medium of publication consulted (Print).
- Anthology in a series** Author of essay or piece's last name, first name. "Title of Essay or Piece." *Title of Book*, Ed. Editor or Compiler. City of publication: Publishing company, copyright date. Page range for essay or piece. Medium of publication consulted (Print). Series title and number if given.
- Reprinted Article in an Anthology** Author of original piece's last name, first name. "Title of original essay or piece." Information about original publication. Rpt. In *Title of Book*. Ed. Editor or compiler's first name last name. City of publication: Publisher, date. Page range of essay or piece. Medium of publication consulted (Print). Series title and number if given.

Introduction, Preface, Foreword, or Afterword

Author of Introduction, etc. Type of piece (e.g. Introduction). *Title of Book*. By Author. Editor. City of Publication: Publication company, Date. Page range. Medium of publication consulted (Print).

ARTICLE IN A REFERENCE BOOK

Article Author of article's last name, first name if listed. "Title of article." *Title of Book*. Ed. Editor of book.
Edition if listed. Volume number. City of Publication: Publishing company,
copyright date. Medium of publication consulted (Print).

ARTICLES

Magazine Author's last name, first name. "Title of article." *Magazine Title* Day Month Year: Page(s). Medium of publication consulted (Print).

Newspaper Author's last name, first name. "Title of article." *Newspaper Title* Day Month Year, edition, Section: Page(s). Medium of publication consulted (Print).

ONLINE RESOURCES

Online Database Citation for original source. *Database Name*. Medium of publication (Web). Access Date (Day Month Year).

Document from a Website Author (if known). "Title of Individual Web Page or Article." *Name of Larger Site*.
Sponsoring institution or organization. Date of article. Medium of publication (Web). Access Date (Day Month Year).

Image Creator if available. "Description or title of image." Date of image if available. Descriptive label (Photograph, Map, Chart, etc). *Title of web site or source*. Publication information. Medium of publication (Print or Web). Access Date (Day Month Year).

MLA Format Significant Updates in Seventh Edition

- No more underlining. Use italics instead.
- No more URLs (web addresses).
- Publication medium. You must indicate the medium of the source. Examples: Print. Web. Television. Film. Lecture. DVD.
- New abbreviations for missing information:
 - No publisher: n.p.
 - No date: n.d.
 - No pages: n.pag.
